You'll find real tactics, real case studies, and grounded insight into how people are resisting right now, from Atlanta to Appalachia, from Line 5 to your block.

- Tactical disruption, defense, and digital sabotage strategies
- Case examples from Cop City, Standing Rock, and anti-pipeline actions
- Tools for building decentralized protest pods, mesh networks, and eviction defense
- Info-warfare guidance: livestreaming, leaks, memetics, and culture jamming
- Self-defense, OpSec, and trauma response for trans organizers
- How to build parallel power: housing, clinics, barter economies, celebration spaces

Because “fighting back” isn't just a slogan, it's **infrastructure in motion**.

## ⚠ Context: Why We Fight

The U.S. in 2025 is a landscape of repression, but also resistance. From state violence to corporate authoritarianism, we are targeted for existing. Fighting back isn't symbolic, it's strategic. It's survival. It's freedom.

This guide is for anyone ready to organize, disrupt, protect, and defy. We're not here to beg power for crumbs. We're here to dismantle it.





## Forms of Resistance

### Tactical Categories

- **Disruption** – Interrupting business, politics, or violence-as-usual
- **Defense** – Protecting people, spaces, and resources
- **Sabotage** – Delaying, degrading, or disabling hostile systems
- **Creation** – Building parallel infrastructures: housing, health, food, care

### Street-Level Tactics (Recent Use Cases)

#### Direct Action

- **Cop City Protests (Atlanta):** Site occupations, barricades, sabotage of construction
- **50501 Movement:** Mass walkouts, bridge shutdowns, soft blockades
- **Pipeline Resistance:** Lockdowns, tree sits, pressure valve sabotage (Line 5, MVP)

#### Protest Evolution

- Decentralized flash mobs using SMS trees
- Protest pods with rotating marshals, medics, and security
- Use of umbrellas, shields, and mesh to block surveillance

#### Information Warfare

- Livestreams via drones and encrypted cams
- Counter-propaganda zines, memes, and projection bombs
- Anonymous leaks exposing police and corporate abuse





## **Defensive Tactics**

## **Personal Defense**

- Community self-defense training (martial arts, de-escalation, trauma care)
- Legal observer networks (NLG, CopWatch)
- Trans/queer neighborhood patrols (e.g. Minneapolis, Chicago pods)

## **Space Defense**

- Occupy-to-defend strategy: squatting vacant buildings, fortifying protest camps
- Digital defense: mesh networks, alt comms, community servers
- Eviction defense squads using noise, blockades, and rapid mobilization

## **Cyber Sabotage**

- Exposing fascist organizing channels
- Disruption of far-right propaganda networks (bot flooding, reporting brigades)
- Mutual aid tech: apps for bail funds, crisis check-ins, secure dropboxes

## **OpSec in Action**

- Using Tails, Signal, ProtonMail, and burner phones for ops
- Avoiding Google products entirely in high-risk operations
- Steganography to hide resistance messages in images or files

## **Building Counterpower**

## **Parallel Infrastructure**

- Autonomous housing cooperatives & encampments
- Free community clinics, food networks, defense collectives
- Barter and gift economies that bypass state capitalism

## **Cultural Resistance**

- Music, drag, art, storytelling as political acts
- Reclaiming public space through murals, dance, ritual
- Celebrating trans, disabled, mad, and undocumented joy as revolt
